On the first Sunday of this month, Christians all over the world will remember the greatest act of love in all the universe as we receive the bread and wine of Holy Communion. Holy Communion is the sacrament which lifts up Christ and His sacrificial love for us. I recently received a story which bears witness to the power of such sacrificial love.

Jack Kelley, a reporter for USA Today once told the story of the ravaging famine in Somalia, East Africa. In a village decimated by starvation, a photographer noticed a little boy suffering from malnutrition. When the photographer handed a grapefruit to the little boy, he was so weak that he couldn't even handle the grapefruit. A member of the crew cut it in half and gave it to him. He picked it up, looked as if to say thanks, and walked back toward his village. There on the ground was another little boy, the first boy's younger brother, who appeared to be dead, his eyes completely glazed over. His older brother knelt down, bit off a piece of the grapefruit and chewed it for a moment. He then opened up his younger brother's mouth, put the chewed piece in, and worked his brother's jaws up and down.

Later, the news crew learned that the older brother had done the same routine for about two weeks until he, himself, finally died of malnutrition. The younger brother survived.

Much like the little brother in the preceding story we live today and have the hope of eternal life all because of the love of Christ, our elder brother who gave His life that we might have life. Truly there is no greater love than this!

Come celebrate the love of God on World Communion Sunday, October 2nd, in the year of our Lord 2011.


