From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we continue our journey of Epiphany, I have been reflecting on the awesome wonder of the transformation power of the light of the world, Jesus Christ. While studying at Methesco, the Rev. Dr. John Giltner once shared these words in our church history class: "there is nothing more wondrous than the transformation of a soul in Jesus Christ!" 1835-1917: Wesleyan Methodist Church wrote about one of these miraculous transformations in Christ.

On the Fiji Island of Bau where Ratu Cakobau lived, there used to be a cannibal killing stone. The captives in war, who were still alive when they were brought to the island, were killed on that stone in a savage manner of which we have a surviving description. When Cakobau became a Christian through the ministry of Methodist missionary Reverend Joseph Waterhouse, he told his people that the killing stone must never again be used for that purpose. He declared he would build a church house, and pulled down all 17 of the heathen temples that were in Bau. From the foundation stones of these temples he build a church, the walls of which are three feet thick! Then he took the killing stone on which war victims had been killed before being cooked in the cannibal ovens, and he said, "This stone will henceforth be used to the Glory of God."



stone into a baptismal font, and sat it in front of the congregation, "of old," he said, "it sent people into the cannibal oven, henceforth it is going to bring them into the Kingdom of God."

This cannibal king became a great leader and a great Christian. When Cakobau died those who were there besides him reported his last words, "Hold me Jesus, my faith in Thee is firm!"

How great a salvation that was-from a cannibal who had devoured a thousand bodies to a Christian leader with a firm faith in the Lord! To repeat the witness of the Rev. Dr. John Giltner: **"There is nothing more wondrous than the transformation of a soul in Jesus Christ!"**
