### Mission Field

Dear Congregation,

You have been our friends for many years, standing by us as we went to far-off Africa for missions. As you know, being out there took a toll on us and we needed some time to regroup. In the last 4 years, we have profited from the help of friends and counselors, spent more time in God's Word, and come to see the bigger picture of ourselves and our relationship as a couple.

The time has finally come to return to Chad. Actually, we don't know the exact date when the Lord will take us there, but He gave Rick the inclination to move toward returning, aiming for the end of this year. In faith, we told our employers that we would not be returning to work in the school system this next year. In a church service, God also confirmed to us that our calling is still to bring the Kanembu to Him.

In our last few terms, we saw that with us, the openness of the K'bu people in Bol has been diminishing. Currently, there are 2 other couples working in Bol, so they will be able to continue to reach out there. Rick and I will be living in the capital city, and continuing the OneStory project that we had College Care Packages begun last term – but with an exciting new Bible stories and turn them into oral Bible stories that people can easily understand and tell to their friends. In this way, people who don't have a Bible, can begin to change their minds about God and learn to worship Him in small groups. Cru (Campus Crusade) undergraduate or graduate school. Any who trained us has come up with a more efficient and effective way to get the job done. We have spoken with them about the new methods and they will be partnering

with us as we facilitate a School of Storying workshop with K'bu contacts.

By facilitating a workshop, we would like to get a story set done in a short time and get K'bu people discussing God's Word in Story Groups all around the city of Ndjamena.

We'd like to be able to tell you about the new approach we intend to implement. It's going to be a big undertaking and we will need a good back-up team to "pray in" a whole set of Story Crafters and to give to make the workshop a possibility. We will probably be visiting your church in November and we hope to tell you more about how you can be a part of this ministry through prayer and giving.
